WHAT IS THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S INTERNATIONAL AWARD

THE AWARD

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is the world's leading youth achievement award, bringing together practical experiences and life skills to equip young people for life.

For young people between 14 and 24 years old

Challenge yourself

Since it was founded in 1956 by His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh (husband to Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom), over eight million young people have participated in the Award in over 140 countries and territories. Schools, colleges, universities, employers, social clubs, youth organisations such as the Scouts, Girl Scouts and Girl Guides, young offenders' institutions, religious organisations, sports clubs and more all run the Award.

WHAT IS INVOLVED?

The Award is voluntary, non-competitive, enjoyable and balanced, and requires effort over time. There are three levels to the Award: Bronze, Silver and Gold. Young people design their own Award programme, set their own goals and record their own progress. They choose a Service, Physical Recreation, Skills activity, go on an Adventurous Journey and, to achieve a Gold Award, take part in a residential project. The only person they compete against is themselves, by challenging their own beliefs about what they can achieve.

With assistance from adult Leaders, participants select and set objectives in each of the following areas:

- Volunteering: undertaking service to individuals or the community.
- Physical: improving in an area of sport, dance or fitness activities.
- Skills: developing practical and social skills and personal interests.
- Expedition: planning, training for and completion of an adventurous journey in the UK or abroad.
- At Gold level, participants must do an additional fifth Residential section

THE ADVENTUROUS JOURNEY

LES ELFES IS ONE OF THE FIRST LICENSED ITAP'S

In 2014, Les Elfes has been licensed as one of the first International Trained Activity Providers (ITAP) worldwide to deliver the Adventurous Journey and/or Residential Project of The Duke of Edinburgh's Award. We are the first ITAP based in Switzerland.

Our staff involved in delivering the Adventurous Journey section have completed the 'Adventurous Journey Supervisor and Assessor Course' in Chamonix delivered by the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Foundation. Situated in the heart of the Swiss Alps, Les Elfes offer a highly engaging Duke of Edinburgh's International Award programme at each of the three stages, Bronze, Silver and Gold enabling participants to really use their imaginaon and creativity in designing their custom expeditions. While being on their adventurous journey, they will have the chance to hike in the Combin region, following trails near Crans-Montana.

INTRODUCTION

The opportunity to engage in adventurous activities in a new environment provides participants with the chance to learn more about their wider environment, as well as develop their self-confidence, teamwork and health. The Adventurous Journey section aims to take young people out of their comfort zone but within a safe and secure setting achieved through suitable training and supervision.

ETHOS

The Adventurous Journey Section seeks to provide participants with a unique, challenging and memorable experience. The Venture, with an agreed purpose, should be undertaken in a small team in an unfamiliar environment, requiring determination, physical effort, perseverance and co-operation to complete.

The key elements are teamwork in planning and undertaking a journey against the background of real challenges posed by an unfamiliar environment.




MEET THE ASSESSORS AND SUPERVISORS

SUMMER EXPEDITIONS

Our typical programme runs for 7 days, including an assessment expedition and other exciting Les Elfes Outdoor Adventurous Activities. We also propose a more comprehensive programme including both the practice expedition and the assessment expedition. We can offer flexible programmes to suit your requirements from 5-14days from May to the End of October.

In the long version of the course the students will benefit from two expeditions, the first one will be monitored constantly by our own mountain guides who will teach them and help them navigate their route. The second expedition is the real one where the students will be on their own, but a guide will be constantly observing them in case of any incidents.

During the short program, the group will have a day training under real conditions. The end of the trip will be the real expedition where the students will be on their own, with one of our mountain guides being near in case of emergencies.

On your request we can add a Taste of Switzerland day where they will visit the Chocolate factory, Cheese factory and the Olympic museum on the shores of Lac Leman. Also we are happy to provide different sport activities in the resort which include the rope course park, mountain biking, rock climbing, swimming pool, golf and many other sports.





THE BRONZE **PROGRAMME**

provide an ideal platform to begin the progression through the D of E award scheme. We present the candidates with the criteria for the award and explain expedition, their assessment expedition and their assessment presentations during the week. To initiate and develop group cohesion we also offer a initiate and develop group cohesion we also offer a range of team building, problem solving and trust exercises to develop their group dynamics. Then we challenge them in their groups to complete orienteering challenges, working towards being able to plan their own itinerary for their expeditions. The second Bronze Award Programme is designed for groups who have already completed a practice expedition before coming to Les Elfes. This programme is to facilitate the Assessment Expedition and also allows groups to experience the exciting Outdoor and Adventurous Activities we offer

THE SILVER PROGRAMME

The Silver Award is designed for those who have already completed the Bronze Award and over the age of 15. Due to the length of the expedition for the Silver Award, which is 3 days and 2 nights, our one-week programme combines an assessment expedition combined with a selection of other activities that we offer. The longer programme contains a training expedition followed by an assessment expedition.

Yes... you have understood this correctly. Les Elfes International is now offering the opportunity to complete on-snow winter Adventurous Journeys at all levels of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Programme. These can include snow-shoeing, Ski Touring & Split Board expeditions which meet the criteria of an Adventurous Journey and offer participants the incredible experience of completing their expedition in the Swiss Alps whilst learning new snow-sports skills. Running from December 1st until April 30th in 3 ski resorts in the Swiss Alps.

We hold a Duke of Edinburgh's International Award ITAP licence which means that we are an "Internationally Trained Activity Provider" for the award and have a team of Award Leaders, Assessors and Supervisors available at each of our camps. Or experienced staff are familiar with the requirements of an Adventurous Journey and work closely with participants during their training and practice expeditions to help them to develop the necessary skills to be successful n the qualifying journeys.

WINTER ADVENTUROUS JOURNEY PACKAGES

During our Adventurous Journey programmes participants are supervised at all times by our experienced instructors as they explore the beautiful terrain of the Verbier ski area. Since the temperatures at night can be quite gruelling participants travel between Mountain Huts and Refuges where they will sleep inside but still carry the equipment to prepare all of their own meals. The must plan their own routes and choose which Mountain Huts they would like to stay in.

Our typical packages for the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Adventurous Journeys include a combination of expedition training, ski/ snowboard/ snowshoe lessons, either 1 or 2 expeditions which may be training or qualifying & cultural excursions in Switzerland. We can also offer the Residential section as part of the Gold Award.

At our camps we are able to offer all of the skiing/ snowboarding/ snowshoeing equipment and have ski pants and jackets available to rent. All of the group equipment and some of the personal equipment for expeditions is also available including:

- rucksacks
- 1st aid kits
- stoves & gas
- cook sets/ cutlery/ pans/ plates/ cups etc.
- head torches
- sleeping bags
- roll mats
- sleeping bag liners

EXCURSIONS

The options include tasting some of the finest swiss chocolates and cheeses at the factories in Gruyere, a guided tour of the United Nations or Swiss Red Cross museum in Geneva, an interactive tour of the Olympic museum in Lausanne, walking inside a glacier at the nearby ice caves in Chamonix, visiting many of the beautiful castles in the area and many many more options.

VERBIER SWITZERLAND

In the heart of one of the most popular regions of the Swiss Alps, Verbier is located at 1500m with lifts up to the Mont-Fort glacier (3300m). Directly opposite Le Grand Combin which rises to 4300m, Verbier's stunning location on a south facing plateau guarantees an exceptionally sunny climate. In addition to a breathtaking panorama, Verbier is a cosmopolitan resort with a variety of shopping, eating and entertainment possibilities, and deserves its reputation as one of Europe's finest mountain resorts.

CRANS MONTANA SWITZERLAND
